And keep me in their blessed sight. Amen.

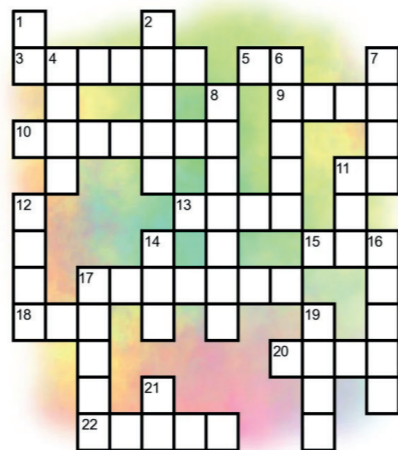
Tuesday

How can we be close to Jesus? Here are some ways:

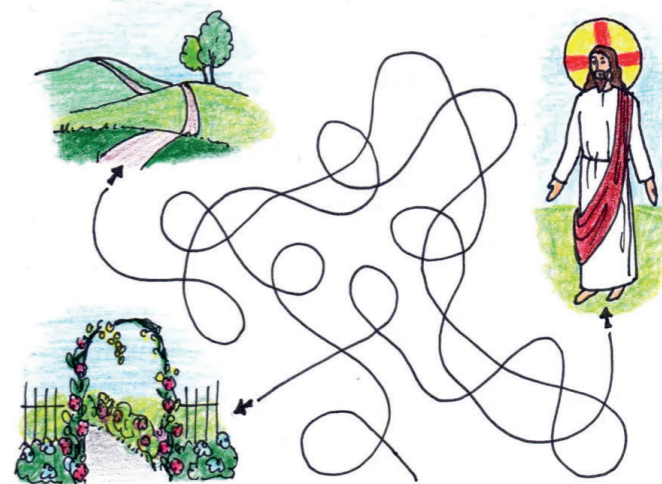
Pray to Jesus. Prayer is talking with God. When we want to be friends with someone we talk with them a lot.

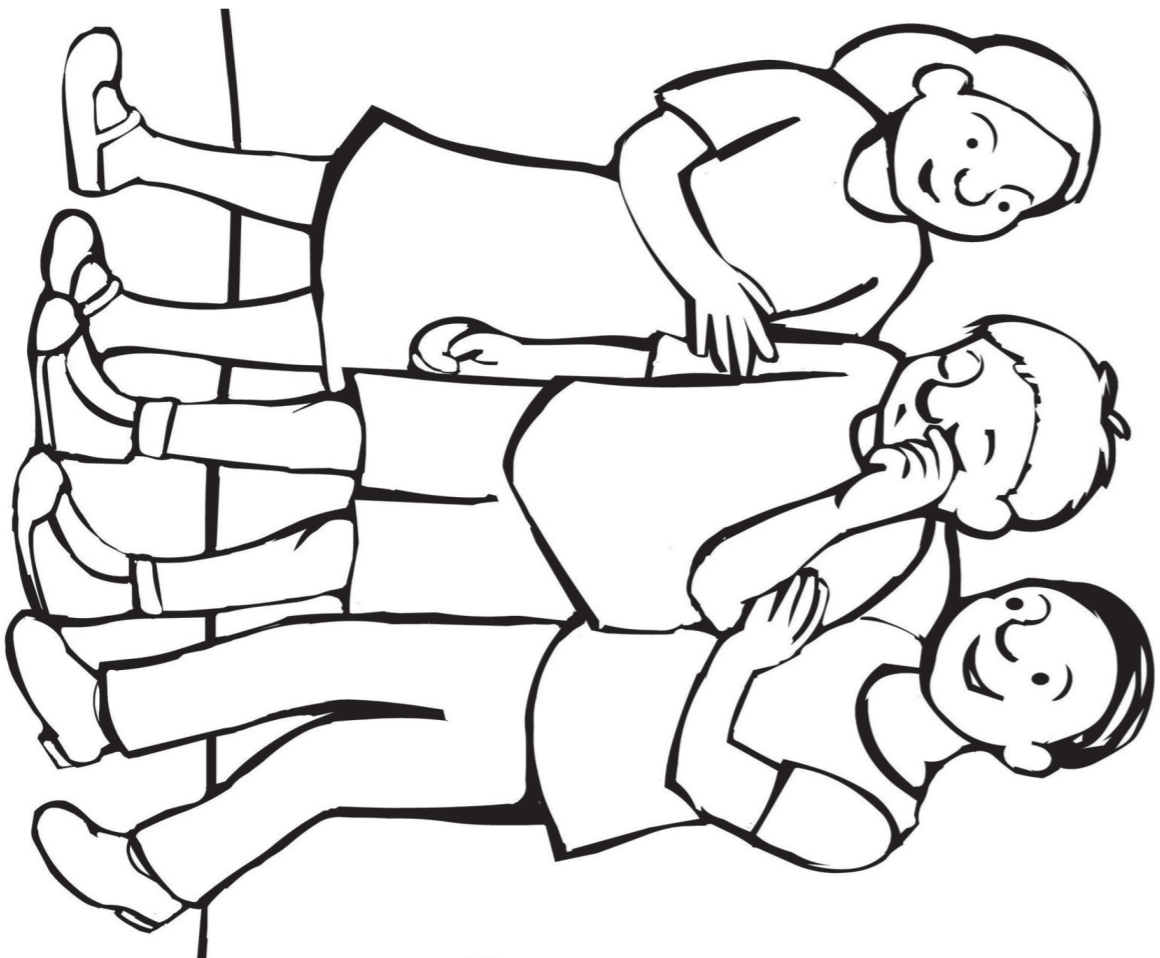
Intercessions
